Geoffrey P. Colwick, 48, of Plainville, husband of Denise Bonneau Colwick and father of Lauren Tanner Colwick, died Friday September 10, 2004 at his home. Born in New Britain, son of Donald and Rose Cassolino Colwick, he is a graduate of Pulaski High School, Class of 1975, he attended Tunxis Community College, and had been a Plainville resident since 1986. Geoff was employed in the telecommunication industry for 20 years, beginning with Northern Telecom, continuing with Jackson Voice Data in Rocky Hill until he left to found his own company Techtele Communication of Berlin where he worked until 2002. Most recently he was associated with Shared Technologies of Milford and Frontrunner Network Systems of Albany, NY.

Besides his wife of 27 years Denise and his daughter Lauren, he is survived by four sisters, Cheryl Robertson and her husband John of North Haledon, NJ; Elizabeth Elersich and her husband Andrew of Euclid, OH; and Roberta Sirois of Manchester; Kimberly Hallock and her husband Bob of Meriden; an aunt and uncle, Sylvia and Philip Gosselin of Southington; several nieces and nephews.
