George W. Talbot, 76, of Pierremount Ave., New Britain, died Friday April 14, 2002 at Walnut Hill Care Center. A native and lifelong New Britain resident, he was son of the late George and Katherine Pratt Talbot. A graduate of New Britain High School in 1943, he was a World War II U.S. Navy Veteran.
