Harvey E. Peterson, 70, of Southington, husband of Nancy Hornkohl Peterson, died Thursday June 26, 2003 at Bradley Memorial Hospital. Born in New Britain, he lived in Southington since 1957. A graduate of New Britain High School, class of 1951, he was a U.S. Navy veteran serving with Construction Battalion 4 of the Seabees. Harvey was an electrician with Pattengell Electric of New Britain for 37 years, retiring in 1995. He was a member of Grace United Methodist Church in Southington; Bristol Fish & Game Club; and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 90 of New Haven.

Besides his wife, he leaves 2 sons, Mark Peterson of Southington; and Todd Peterson and his wife Rosemarie of Plainville; a sister, Norma Lyon and her husband Clifford of Henrico, NC; 2 grandchildren, Nathan and Victoria Peterson of Plainville; several nieces and nephews.
