Helen Ann Colwick Malone, 93, formerly of Kensington, residing at the Jerome Home in New Britain, widow of Robert D. Malone, died Saturday August 13, 2005. Born in New Britain, daughter of the late John and Anna Petrilak Colwick, Helen has been a Kensington resident since 1961 and was employed at Sears for 15 years until her retirement in 1978. She was a member of St. Paul's Church in Kensington; a member of the St. Paul's Ladies Guild. An avid artist in her later years, Helen completed many art courses at CCSU and was a member of the Kensington Art League. Her work was shown at the New Britain Museum of American Art and also the Berlin Fair where she took Best in Show.
