Helen Peltzer Winkler, 90, of Kensington died early Wednesday April 16th following a brief illness. She was born in Berlin to Gustav and Martha Metcalf Peltzer, and attended St. Matthew's German School and Plainville High School. She was employed by Stanley Works and after marriage she worked at the former Raphael's Department Store. She then worked until her retirement at Pratt & Whitney Aircraft in Southington for thirty years. Helen enjoyed summers at Indian Neck in Branford, all sorts of crafts and was active in the Ladies Aid Society of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church, where she was a life long member. Her husband of 68 years, Elmer, predeceased her on January 27th.
