March 23, 1909 - July 23, 2003

Hildur Claudelin Morse Bacon, 94, of Kensington, died Wednesday July 23, 2003 at New Britain General Hospital. She was predeceased by 2 husbands, Roger Morse in 1963 and Wesley Bacon in 1980. A lifelong Kensington resident, she graduated from New Britain High School in 1927, Upsala College in 1931, and received her Masters Degree from Trinity College in 1939. Hildur taught in the Berlin school system until 1943 and later in Meriden for 2 years. She was a member and former Clerk of the Kensington Congregational Church. She sang in the church choir for over 50 years, was active in the Women's Service League at the church, and was a member of Martha Chapter, Order of Eastern Star.

Surviving are 2 daughters, Sarah "Sallie" Caliandri and her husband Dante of Kensington; Margaret "Peggy" Pierce and her husband Patrick of Sydney, Maine; a sister, Ruth Ottoson in New Jersey; 3 grandchildren, Heather Urquehart of Monmouth, Maine; Mark Caliandri and David Caliandri of Kensington; 3 great grandsons; several nieces and nephews. She was also predeceased by a grandson, Brian Webb.

Funeral services will be held Saturday 1 PM at Kensington Congregational Church, 312 Percival Avenue, Kensington, CT 06037. Burial will follow in Fairview Cemetery.
