Howard W. Cronin, 69, of Southington and Point O' Woods, Old Lyme, widower of Marilyn (Deccy) Cronin, passed away Friday, January 13, 2017 at his home from Progressive Supranuclear Palsy. Born in Hartford, Howard is a graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1965 and graduated from both the University of New Haven and Charter Oak Community College. He has been a Southington resident since 1968. Howard was a Police Officer for the New Britain Police Department for 20 years and chief of security at Glastonbury High School for 10 years retiring in 2008. He was a member of St. Aloysius Church in Plantsville; the St. Aloysius Holy Name Society; Past State and National Trustee for the Fraternal Order of Police and former Treasurer for the New Britain Police Union for 10 years.

Surviving is a son, Patrick Cronin and his wife Adrienne of Litchfield; two daughters, Kellee Cronin of Southington and Jennifer Scheer of Kensington; a brother, James Cronin, Jr. and his wife Mary of Glastonbury; two sisters, Corinne LaMar of Bristol and Patricia Dains and her husband David of Frisco, Texas; eight grandchildren, Amber Saraceni; Talia, Michaela and Avielle Nanfito; Ryan and Mason Scheer; and Eric and Zackary Cronin; as well as several nieces and nephews.
