



Jacob "Jack" Dinda

August 13, 1925 - February 21, 2004

Jacob "Jack" Dinda, 78, of New Britain, died Saturday February 21, 2004 at New Britain General Hospital. He was the widower of Floris Dinda, who died in 2001. A lifelong New Britain resident, he was a World War II US Navy veteran. A former employee of the Stanley Works, Jack worked at Connecticut Light & Power CL&P for over 20 years, retiring in 1987. He was a member of St. Francis of Assisi Church in New Britain; volunteered at the Hospital for Special Care; was an avid golfer and former member of Stanley Golf Club.
