Janet R. Peichert, 73, of New Britain, passed away peacefully with her family by her side Saturday (December 2, 2023) at the Hospital of Central Connecticut in New Britain, after a brief illness.

Born in Meriden on December, 2, 1950, daughter of the late Raymond Peichert and Martha (Breitenbach) Schnick and Clarence Schnick. She was a graduate of Maloney High School, class of 1968, and was a graduate of Post Jr. College in 1970.
