Jerry Joseph, 58, of New Britain, son of David Joseph of Cromwell and the late Lorraine Albert Joseph, passed away Tuesday August 19, 2008 at the Hospital of Central CT in New Britain. A native and lifelong New Britain resident, Jerry is a graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1967, and received a Bachelor's degree from CCSU. He then went on to receive a Masters Degree in Economics from Trinity College in Hartford. Jerry was employed as a Professor in the Economics Department at CCSU for over 25 years and taught at Tunxis Community College prior to that. He was a member of St. Joseph's Church in New Britain; a member of the National Rifle Association and the IPSC International Practical Shooting Confederation.

Besides his father David, he is survived by a brother, Jody Joseph and his wife Tammy of New Britain; a sister, Gloria Joseph of Biddeford, Maine; a step brother, William Pelletier of New Britain; a niece, Mekenzie Joseph and a nephew, Logan Joseph.
