John G. Fosgrau, Jr., 92, of Kensington, passed away November 26, 2023 with his beloved wife of 68 years, Catherine 'Cathy' (Casarola) by his side.

John loved to share stories of their travels, which always included making friends and many laughs. His sharp memory never failed him, which allowed all the family to feel like we lived his youth and his adventures with him.

John never met a person that wasn't his friend. He was endlessly kind, patient and always in good humor. He lived a life of gratitude and shared his joy and love with the world. He was loved by everyone.
