John F. Howard, 56, of Heatherwood Green, Cromwell, died Thursday Jan. 31, 2002 in Chester. Born in Washington, D.C., he was a former Ohio and Michigan resident, lived in Elkhart, Indiana for 15 years, moving to Cromwell in 1998. A 1963 graduate of Elmore High School in Elmore, Ohio, he later graduated from General Motors Institute and received a Masters in Engineering from Massachusetts Institute of Technology MIT. John worked for General Motors for 20 years, was Vice President of Manufacturing and Chief Operating Officer at American Electronic Components AEC until 1997 and was a Vice President of P/A Industries in Bloomfield for the past 4 years. He was a member of Emmanuel Baptist Church in Newington and attended Emmanuel Baptist Theological Seminary. John was a member of the Tournament Players Club of Cromwell; black Diamond Ranch in Lecanto, FL; and served on the board of directors at Festo, USA on Long Island and Virginia Industries in Rocky Hill.

He was the devoted Husband of Angela Workman Howard and loving father of 4 children; Rachael Owens and her husband Brian of Woodbury, MN; Elizabeth DiMartino and her husband Joseph of Haslet, TX; Amanda Traver and James Traver, both of Cromwell. He also leaves a sister, Jane Taylor and her husband Tom of Whitney, TX; a granddaughter, Anwyn Renee Owens; 2 nieces and a nephew; He is also survived by his 1st wife Jean and her husband Chuck of Willour, IL; He was predeceased by a sister, Sarah

Dusseau.
