John William Maloney, 66, of Harrisville N.H., and Kensington, CT, and winter resident of Sarasota, Florida, husband of Patricia Martin Maloney died Monday July 23 at home. He was born in Willimantic, CT, a graduate of Windham High School Class of 1952 and of Bowdoin College Class of 1956. After serving two years in the Army Adjutant Corps in Ashland, KY, he was employed as an underwriter and later a Special Agent for the Aetna Fire Company in Hartford. Then he was affiliated with W.L. Hatch Co. Insurance Agency in New Britain, then Grenham & Gaul Assurance Agency, and became part of the staff of the Independent Insurance Agents of Connecticut teaching and developing programs for insurance agents. He was employed by R.C. Knox and became one of the principals. Upon retirement he taught insurance at the University of Hartford, worked in manufacturing, and for the I.I.A.C. Many non profit organizations benefited from his participation, including the United way of New Britain, Red Cross, V.N.A. of greater New Britain, YMCA, and I.I.A.C.

Besides his wife, he leaves three children, Julie Maloney Davison and her husband Jim of Milford; Timothy and his wife Alisa Marie Maloney of Carol Stream IL; and Katrina Kathleen Maloney and her husband Mark Jennings of Marlborough, NH; a brother, William Maloney and his wife Shirley, of Sarasota, FL; along with eight grandchildren.

Burial services were held at Willard Hill Cemetery, Chesham, NH on Wednesday. A memorial Service in celebration of John's life will be held at
