John W. Rasemus, 73, of Kensington, husband of Vivian Nyborg Rasemus, died Monday May 12, 2008 at Hospital of Central Connecticut in New Britain. Born in Dixon City, PA, he was a former New Britain resident, moving to Kensington in 1962. A US Navy veteran during the Korean Conflict, John worked at Raymond Engineering which then became Kaman Aerospace in Middlefield for 39 years, retiring in 1997.
