Joseph Alibrio, 82, of New Britain, husband of Frances Martinez Alibrio, died Thursday July 20, 2006 at Hartford Hospital. Born in Hartford, he lived in New Britain for the past 55 years. Joe was educated in Hartford, served with the U.S. Army during World War II, and received a degree from the University of Connecticut after the war. He was employed at Tuttle & Bailey Manufacturing for 30 years, retiring in 1986. Joe was a member and former Vestryman at St. Mark's Episcopal Church in New Britain, and was also involved with the Episcopal Diocese of Connecticut. He was a former member of the New Britain Democratic Town Committee and was a member of the New Britain YMCA; the Pine Tree Rifle Gun Club; and was a member and bookkeeper for Nami of Connecticut. Joe was a former board member of the Community Mental Health Affiliates and served on its Adult Advisory Committee.

Besides his wife Frances, he leaves three daughters, Frances Alibrio-Curran and her husband Joseph of Franklin, Mass; Alice Alibrio of Cottonwood, AZ; and Irene Alibrio in New Britain; a brother, Salvatore Alibrio of Port St. Lucie, FL; two sisters, Mary Lombardo and her husband John of Manchester; and Nancy Andreano and her husband Andrew of Glendale, AZ; several nieces and nephews.

A Memorial Service will be held during the Columbus Day Holiday Weekend in October at St. Mark's Episcopal Church in New Britain at a time and day to be announced. There are no calling hours. Carlson Funeral Home, New Britain is
