Joseph J. Benjamin, 77, of Kensington, loving husband of Juliet Kotowski Benjamin, passed away peacefully at his home Sunday May 2, 2010 surrounded by his family. A New Britain native and former resident, he moved to Kensington in 1964. Joe was a graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1951 and was a US Army Veteran of the Korean Conflict. He was employed at Marlin-Rockwell TRW in Plainville for 35 years, retiring in 1989. Joe was a member of St. Mark's Episcopal Church in New Britain; served on the church Vestry and was a former choir member. He was former permittee of the Marconi Society for many years; was a member of the Berlin VFW Post; and volunteered through St. Marks Church at the Hospital for Special Care for over 30 years. A loving husband, father and grandfather, he was also caregiver to many through his volunteer efforts.
