



Joyce Roberts Slakish

May 3, 1920 - July 4, 2006

Joyce Roberts Slakish, 86, of Kensington, wife of Alfred A. Slakish, died Tuesday July 4, 2006 at New Britain General Hospital. Born in Ely, Cambridgeshire, England, she was a former New Britain resident for 20 years, moving to the Berlin-Kensington area in 1966. Joyce served with the British Army in the Auxiliary Territorial Service during World War II and worked as a plotter in the War Room. She worked at several local places included Landers, Frary & Clark Company; Fafnir Bearing Company; Adkins Printing; Stanley Rule & Level; New Britain General Hospital; Wise-Smith Department Store in Hartford; and the G. Fox Store at Meriden Square. She formerly sang in the choir at First Church of Christ, Congregational in New Britain and once shook hands with the Queen Mother at the Royal Air Force Hospital in Ely, England.

Besides her husband Alfred, she leaves a son, Mark Slakish of Kensington; a sister-in-law, Hazel Roberts of Yorkshire, England; several nieces and nephews; and close personal friends, the Pollowitz family of New Britain and Clinton. She was predeceased by a sister, Ida Stevens and three brothers, Cyril, Fred, and Burt Roberts.

Funeral services are Friday 1 PM in the Erwin Chapel of the South Church, 90 Main Street, New Britain. Burial will be at the convenience of the family.
