



Julianna Perelom

October 30, 1906 - February 7, 2004

Julianna “Julia” Tynik Perelom, of New Britain, died Saturday, February 7, at New Britain General Hospital at the age of 97. She was the oldest parishioner at St. Mary’s Ukrainian Orthodox Church in New Britain. An active participant in the life of the parish as a member of St. Olga’s Sisterhood and the weekly Doll Workshop Group of the Cultural Organization, she attended church regularly until a short time before her death.

Born in New Britain in 1906 to the late John and Mary Tynik, Mrs. Perelom spent the early part of her life in Europe, returning to New Britain in 1926, where she lived until her death. She was predeceased by her husband John in 1998, to whom she had been married for over 66 years. Mrs. Perelom was also predeceased by four brothers; Michael who died in infancy, Miroslav, Walter and another Michael Tynik; and two sisters, Katherine Tynik and Olga Jarosh. She leaves her son, Jerry Perelom of New Britain; her daughter and son-in-law, Dorothy and Joseph Kerel of Newington; two grandchildren, Christopher Kerel of Newington and Alisa Kerel of New Britain; two sisters, Anna Nazar and her husband Jan of New Britain, and Adeline Zadorovna in the Ukraine; a brother, Roman Tynik in Poland; several nieces and nephews. Mrs. Tynik retired from North & Judd Manufacturing Company Gulf & Western in 1972 after many years of service.

She enjoyed being with people and had an engaging sense of humor and an ingratiating warmth which drew people to her. A devoted and loving mother and grandmother, she was loved and respected by her family and her friends.

“Julia” enjoyed traveling, and along with her late husband, particularly relished her frequent family stays in Key West, Florida during the winters.
