



## Julie Oshana Bayram

July 4, 1919 - September 10, 2010

Julie Oshana Bayram, 91, of New Britain, widow of Aram "Otto" Bayram, passed away Friday September 10, 2010 at Hospital of Central CT in New Britain. A native and longtime New Britain resident, she graduated from New Britain High School. Julie got married in 1945 in New Britain and had the biggest wedding of all time. After raising four children, she went to work for the CT Department of Environmental Protection until her retirement. She was a member of the South Church and St. Stephen's Armenian Apostolic Church in New Britain, as well as the Assyrian American Veterans Organization.

Surviving are her four children, Armen Bayram and his wife Barbara of Portland; Deborah Reynolds and her husband Timothy of Key West, FL; Steven Bayram and his wife Mary Ann of New Britain; and Paul Bayram of Gainesville, FL; a sister, Jane Carroll of Rocky Hill; three grandchildren, Melissa and her fiancé Richard Santiago; Cheryl and her husband Chet Starosz; and Marc Bayram; two great grandchildren, Jenna and Jayden; several nieces and nephews. Besides her husband Otto, she was predeceased by a brother, Samuel Oshana. Julie was loved by so many people from all over the country. If love could have kept her alive, she would have never died.
