



Katharine Kimball Coe

May 5, 1905 - April 17, 2003

Katharine Kimball Coe, 97, of New Britain, died Thursday April 17, 2003 at her home. She was the widow of Donald O. Coe, who died in 1956. Born in Auburndale, Mass., Katharine was formerly of Vicksburg Miss., and has been a New Britain resident since 1956. Katharine received a Bachelors degree in Mathematics from Denison University in 1927, a Masters Degree from the University of Mississippi in 1954, and later a Certificate of Advanced Studies from Wesleyan Univeristy. Katharine was employed as a Math Teacher at All Saints Episcopal Jr. College in Vicksburg, Mississippi for 11 years; taught at New Britain High School for 9 years and later at several area Community Colleges, retiring in 1977. She was a member of South Congregational-First Baptist Church in New Britain, the Esther Stanley Chapter of DAR; and was a Sunday School Teacher for many years.

Surviving are 2 sons, Richard D. Coe and his wife Penelope of New Britain, and Robert K. Coe and his wife Martha of Sudbury, Mass; a sister, Ruth Kimball of New Britain; 5 grandchildren, Lawrence Coe of New Britain, Randall Coe of Windsor, Russell Coe of New Britain, Thomas Coe of Revere, Mass., and Elizabeth Coe of Elkins Park, PA; 3 great grandchildren; several nieces and nephews. Katharine was predeceased by 2 brothers, Spofford H. Kimball, and Perley B. Kimball.

A memorial service will be held Saturday May 10, 2003 1 PM at South Congregational-First Baptist Church, New Britain. There are no calling hours. A graveside service will be held Tuesday at Oak Hill Cemetery, Newburyport,
