Keith G. Bova, 67, of New Britain, husband of Ann (Marinelli) Bova, passed away Tuesday, July 24, 2018 at home. Born and raised in Long Branch, NJ, he lived in Memphis, TN for 11 years, moving to New Britain in 1980. A graduate of Long Branch High School, he received his Bachelor's Degree from Christian Brothers College in Memphis. Keith worked in management, sales and other positions with FedEx from 1977 to 2004 and later for Rexel Corp. in Hartford for 13 years, retiring in June 2017. He enjoyed his years as a literacy volunteer, among other community activities. He was a member of the Friday afternoon golf league at Stanley Golf Course in New Britain; Saturnites at Shuttle Meadow Country Club and was a former baseball and youth soccer coach. Keith loved playing tennis and golf, and had a lifelong love of the New York Yankees.

Keith was a loving husband and was devoted to his family. Besides Ann, his wife of over 40 years, he leaves a son, Keith Bova II, his wife Victoria and their children Sophia, Audrey and Luke; a sister-in-law, Constance Mazzarella and her husband Vinnie, a brother-in-law, Michael Marinelli and his wife Victoria, and a brother, Kevin Bova and his wife Eileen; and several nieces, nephews and cousins.
