



## Kenneth H. Gill

July 25, 1910 - March 24, 2005

Kenneth H. Gill, 94, of Eddy Glover Boulevard, New Britain, died Thursday March 24, 2005 at New Britain General Hospital. Kenneth was the son of Charles and Emma Travers Gill. He was a State of Connecticut Employee starting his service at Vance School in 1934 and was transferred to Central Connecticut State University in 1936 and retired as Assistant Supervisor of Building and Grounds in 1971. Mr. Gill was born in Hotchkissville, a small village north of Woodbury, CT on July 25, 1910. He and his parents moved to Reynolds Bridge, a suburb of Thomaston, CT where he continued his schooling and graduated from Thomaston High School in June of 1928. After a period of two years in New Haven, where he was a popular baseball player, he moved to New Britain in September of 1930. Mr. Gill was a well-known baseball player in New Britain, playing for such teams as Landers, Frary & Clark, Mildrum Jewels, East Berlin Mohawks and American Hardware, all in the Local Industrial League, beginning in 1932. He also played in various semi-pro teams in the area. Kenneth was a member of the Unity Lodge # 148 formerly known as the Centennial Lodge #118 of the Masonic Order since 1952.

Surviving is a son, Robert Gill of Middletown; a daughter Paula Oshana of Southington; a dear companion, Anne Wilchynsky of Kensington; six grandchildren, Robin Gill of Middletown; Major Kenneth Gill of Fort Hood, TX; Amanda Gill of Malden, MA; Charles Gill of Lungwood, FL; Robert Oshana of Sugarland, TX; and Scott Oshana of Southington; and twelve great

grandchildren. Besides his wife Jane Kling Gill, he was predeceased by a granddaughter, Tracey Oshana.

Funeral services will be held Saturday 2 PM at St. Mark's Episcopal Church, 147 West Main Street, New Britain. Calling hours will be held Friday TODAY 4 to 7 PM and Saturday from 1 to 1:30 PM at Carlson Funeral Home, 45 Franklin Square, New Britain. Burial will be at the convenience of the family.
