Kenneth L. Knowles, 76, of West Melbourne, FL and New Britain, husband of Shirley Richard Knowles, died February 15, 2005 in Florida. A longtime New Britain resident, he lived in Florida since 1990. Ken was a U.S. Army veteran, serving during the Korean Conflict and was employed at CCSU in Facility Management for 21 years, retiring in 1991.
