Kenneth L. Vibberts, 91, of West Hartford, widower of Ethel Johnson Vibberts, passed away Tuesday July 21, 2009 at Hughes Health and Rehabilitation in West Hartford. A New Britain native and former resident, he moved to West Hartford in 1952. Ken graduated from New Britain High School in 1938 and was a World War II US Army veteran. He worked for M. Swift & Sons in Hartford for over twenty five years, retiring in 1988. He was a member and former usher at First Lutheran Church in New Britain; was a sixty year member of Unity Lodge 148, AF& AM; and was formerly active with the local Boy Scout troop.
