Lauren (Foster) Petisce, 33, of New York City, passed away on September 3, 2019, surrounded by her family after a courageous battle with breast cancer. Lauren was a graduate of Newington High School, Class of 2004. She received her B.S. in Exercise Science from Sacred Heart University in Fairfield, where she was captain of the Women's Golf Team. Lauren later received a Doctorate of Physical Therapy (DPT) from Sacred Heart. She was a Senior Physical Therapist at Mount Sinai Hospital West in New York City since January 2015 and formerly served at hospitals in New Haven and Philadelphia before moving to New York.

Lauren was the wife of the late Daniel Petisce and is survived by her parents, Noel and Kristine (Gjerpen) Foster of Newington. She also leaves her maternal grandmother, Georgette Gjerpen of Newington; her brother, Kevin Foster and his wife Michele of San Francisco, CA; their daughter Molly; her beloved dog, Lucy; as well as many aunts, uncles, cousins and friends.
