Lawrence E. "Larry" Schoech, 72, of Kensington, passed away Thursday July 12, 2012 at his home. Born in New Britain, son of the late Carl and Lillian Hoffman Schoech, he had been a Kensington resident since 1950. A graduate of Berlin High School, Class of 1958, he received a Bachelors Degree from the University of Connecticut in Mathematics. Larry was employed at the Peck Spring Company for 10 years and then at Aetna Life & Casualty in Hartford for 21 years in Information Technology before retiring in 1995. He then worked part time in the Golf Shoppe at the Shuttle Meadow County Club. He was a member of St. Matthews Lutheran Church in New Britain where he served on the Board of Finance for many years until 2004 and began attending Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in 2007. Larry was a member of the Timberlin Men's Golf Club where he was the Clubs Second President in 1973, and was a charter member of the Berlin Investor's Club at Peck Memorial Library. In the 1990's, Larry took up fly fishing and spent many enjoyable days fishing with friends and taking trout fishing trips. He also enjoyed gardening, flowers and vegetables.

Surviving are two nephews, Jeremy Schoech and his wife Elizabeth of Spring, TX; and Stephen Schoech and his wife Andrea of Southington; and a niece, Laurine Lynch and her husband Bill of New Britain. Besides his parents, Larry was predeceased by a brother Peter Schoech in 2004.

Funeral service will be held Tuesday 10 AM at St. Matthews Lutheran Church, 99 Franklin Square, New Britain, CT 06051. Burial will be in Fairview Cemetery.
