Leroy B.T. Urbanski, 81, of New Britain, widower of Noelle (Tangarone) Urbanski, passed away Wednesday (February 10, 2021) at Jefferson House in Newington. A New Britain resident all of his life, he was a Managing Accountant at the Stanley Works Headquarters (also "World Headquarters") for 44 years, retiring in 2000.
