



Lester A. Bagley, Jr.

March 1, 1934 - March 24, 2017

Lester Albert Bagley, 83, lifelong resident of New Britain, played his last hand on March 24, 2017. Born March 1, 1934 in New Britain to the late Lester A. Bagley, Sr and Vera (Carswell) Bagley. He was married for 50 years to his beloved wife Patricia Nan (Glidden) Bagley until her passing and was predeceased by his precious daughter Elizabeth.

Lester will be missed by his sons, Craig Bagley and his wife Lisa of Unionville and Jonathan Bagley and his wife Karin of Burlington and by his grandsons, Steven, Erik, and Matthew. Lester was predeceased by his brother, Kurt Bagley and leaves behind his brother Lance Bagley of Fort Meyers, FL and his two sisters, Sherryl Bannon of Plantsville, and Judith Taricani of Wolfeboro, NH. Lester leaves behind many loving in-laws, cousins, nieces, nephews, friends, and was best known by family and friends for his generosity.

Lester was a graduate of CCSU and began his teaching career in 1958. He taught US History, Geography and Civics to middle schoolers in Bristol, retiring in 1994. He especially loved taking his students on his annual trip to Washington DC as well as to Boston's Freedom Trail and Yankee Stadium. Lester founded the New Britain Area Conference of Churches Softball League in 1973 serving as president for many years. He also founded the Ecumenics service organization in 1971 and brought the Summer Olympics to New

Britain residents in 1972 and 1973.
