



Lillian Suess Amyot

October 3, 1910 - November 4, 2002

Lillian Suess Amyot, 92, of Kensington, died Monday November 4, 2002 at her home. She is the widow of Dr. Rudolph Amyot, a prominent Obstetrician-Gynecologist from Troy New York, who died in 1985. A New Britain native and former resident, she lived in Waterford, NY from 1947 until 1987, coming to Kensington in 1993. A graduate of New Britain High School Class of 1928, Lillian received Bachelors and Masters Degrees in Nursing from Columbia University and served as a faculty member in the School of Nursing at Presbyterian Hospital in New York City. She also was a co-author of a text book on nursing procedures. She was a member of the Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Kensington; the Ladies League at the church; the Berlin Senior Citizens; the Community Art League of Kensington; and AARP. A former member of St. Ann's Church in Waterford New York, she was a founding member and the first President of the Waterford Historical Society. She is survived by many nieces and nephews including Christine Lashenka of New Britain; Judith Chevalier of Kissimmee, FL; Linda Suess of Tolland; Kathy Miller of Naples, FL; William Frederick of Cheshire; Donald Suess of East Windsor; and Patricia Modzelewski of New London; Two sisters-in-law, Ruth Suess of Tolland and Vera Suess of Manchester. She was predeceased by 2 sisters and 5 brothers.

Funeral services will be held Thursday 1:30 PM at the Carlson Funeral Home 45 Franklin Square New Britain. Burial will be in Fairview Cemetery. Calling hours are Thursday 12:30 to 1:30 PM preceding the funeral. Memorial
