Lillian Fleming Beach, 85, of New Britain, wife of Justus S. Beach, died Thursday April 7, 2005 at her beloved home, surrounded by her family. Born in New Britain, she lived her most of her life. "Lil" was a graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1938 and attended Moody's School of Business. She was an executive secretary at Travelers Insurance Company in Hartford from 1939 to 1949. A longtime member of South Congregational-First Baptist Church, she was former church Moderator; a former deaconess; a member of the Women's Fellowship;

and helped to organize the Missions Mart at church. She also volunteered for numerous civic and community organizations.

Besides her husband, she leaves two sons, Edward Beach of New Britain; and Howard Beach and his wife Deborah of Milton, Mass.; two daughters, Justine Beach DeCruz of New Britain; and Laurel Tyrrell and her husband Richard of Central, Alaska; ten grandchildren; several nieces and nephews.
