After graduating from Kingston High School, she attended Skidmore College before graduating from Boston University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1969. Linda married the love of her life, Peter Goldfarb, in 1966, and they set off on an amazing partnership that would last over 43 years until Peter's passing in 2010. Linda passed the CPA exam and started a career working in finance and accounting. She joined the State of Connecticut Department of Developmental Disabilities rising through the ranks, before eventually serving as Commissioner for the State of Connecticut in 1995. After retiring, Linda and Peter lived in Sao Paulo, Brazil and then France, where Linda was active in social organizations and clubs, especially in the town of Neuilly-sur-Seine where they lived.
