



## Lorraine (Warner) Covaleski

October 4, 1927 - February 19, 2017

Lorraine E. (Warner) Covaleski, 89, of New Britain, wife of the late Stanley “Sam” Covaleski, passed away Sunday (February 19, 2017) at the Hospital of Central Connecticut in New Britain. A native and lifelong New Britain resident, she was daughter of the late Charles and Laura (Suprenant) Warner. Lorraine graduated from New Britain High School in 1945 and was a telephone operator for SNET and later was an executive secretary for 23 years at the former Tuttle & Bailey Company in New Britain. She was a member of St. Andrew’s Church in New Britain and was active with the Women’s Auxiliary of VFW Post 511 in New Britain.

Surviving are two sons, Paul E. Covaleski of Murrell’s Inlet, SC and Dr. Mark Covaleski and his wife Martha Pittman of Madison, WI; two sisters, Marjorie Lazicki and Vivian Drachenberg, both of New Britain; five grandchildren, James Covaleski and his wife Jessica of Southington; Daniel Covaleski of New Britain; Paul, Nicholas and Aaron Covaleski, of of Madison, WI; a great grandson, Jacob Covaleski, a soon to arrive great granddaughter, Julia Lorraine Covaleski; several nieces and nephews. Besides her husband and parents, Lorraine was predeceased by two brothers, Leslie and Irving Warner and four sisters, Dorothy Simons, Adeline Charamut, Bernice Lazar and Marion Sepko.

Lorraine had a wonderful rapport with all five of her now-grown grandsons. Somehow she went from being an adoring Grandma when they were little boys (and an adoring great-Grandma to Jacob) to being a source of support and wisdom as her grandsons became young men. Lorraine was also a source of motherly affection for the friends of her sons who grew up in Sunvale Manor. And with a life of sons, grandsons, and a great-grandson, Lorraine found great enjoyment and love in some dear friends, her sisters, nieces, and her grand-daughter-in-law Jessica, with cherished expectations of Julia Lorraine. Finally, Lorraine very much enjoyed her Warner heritage, seeking out at least 14 generations of Warners all across Southern New England.
