Manuel "Manny" Andrews, 100, of New Britain, passed away Saturday January 24, 2015 at the Hospital of Central CT in New Britain. Born in Wareham, Mass., he lived in New Britain most of his life and graduated from New Britain High School. A World War II U.S. Navy Veteran, Manny was employed at New Britain Machine Company in the Tool Division for 43 years, retiring in 1980. Manny was member of the North New Britain Congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses. He was a faithful servant of Jehovah God for over 55 years.

Manny was predeceased by his first wife, Elsie Glover Andrews and his second wife, Ethel Mae Czaplicki-Andrews. Surviving is his sister, Gloria Alves, the last of eight children, of Southington; many nieces and nephews; his step family, the Czaplicki's; along with scores of faithful friends.
