Marceline "Marcie" Woods Cormier, 96, of Kensington, widow of William J. Cormier, passed away Saturday February 23, 2013 at Ledgecrest Healthcare Center. Born in Southington, she was a former New Britain resident, moving to Kensington in 1956. Marcie was a graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1934 and attended Teachers College of Connecticut now CCSU. As a young woman, she worked in the Actuarial Department at CT Mutual Life Insurance Company. She was a member of St. Paul's Church and its Ladies Guild. She served on the Board of the New Britain Boys & Girls Club and the New Britain YWCA. She was also a member of the Kensington Garden Club; the Women' Club of New Britain and of CT Yankee Council, Girl Scouts.
