Margaret "Peggy" Rund Fresen-Buffering, 94, of Burlington, beloved wife, mother, grandmother and great grandmother, passed away Sunday September 9, 2012 and went to heaven to be with Jesus. She was predeceased by two husbands, Herman Fresen and William Buffering. Born in New Britain, she was a former Newington resident for 20 years, moving to Burlington in 1986. Peggy was a graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1936 and then attended Moody's Secretarial School.
