Margaret Miller "Peg" Schleicher, 99, wife of the late Raymond H. Schleicher, died Sunday August 9, 2015 at Jerome Home in New Britain. A New Britain High School graduate, class of 1934, she worked for the Phoenix Life Insurance Company until she married her husband Raymond in 1939. They were married for 52 years. As a youth, she taught religious education at First Congregational Church in New Britain, was involved with the Rainbows, the Girl Scouts, and the Daughters of Scotia at the Scottish Rite Masonic Temple. Joining First Lutheran Church in 1961, she was a past president of the Priscilla Unit, sang in the choir, and was on the Altar Guild. Margaret was a resident of Glen Street for over 51 years and was a cub scout den mother.

Surviving is a son, John "Jack" Schleicher and his wife Donna of West Chatham, Mass; a grandson, Karl Schleicher of West Chatham, Mass; two great grandsons, Keenan and Jackson who called her GIGI for great grandma; a niece, Susan Miller Lefebvre; three nephews, Roger Svensk, Hugh Miller and John Miller; and many cousins. Besides her husband Raymond, she was predeceased by a son, Raymond G. Schleicher and a brother, Hugh Miller, Sr.
