Mark Hartwell Jones, 81, of Kensington passed away Tuesday, November 13. Born in New Britain, he was the husband and best friend of Beverly Dehm Jones and father to Linda Jones White of Bristol, RI, Valerie Kane of Manhattan, NY and Constance Castillo of Woodstock, CT. Mark graduated from New Britain High School, Class of 1943 and then attended Trinity College, Colgate University and the University of Georgia in preparation for the Navy Pilot V12 Officers Training, WW II. After his service, he returned to New Britain and was President of the Art Jones Co., a fine men's haberdashery, founded by his father Art. He and his brother William ran the store until closing in 1994. His wife Beverly and sister in-law Susan, expanded the men's store to women's clothing after raising their families and helped run the business together. Mark was an avid pilot, equestrian and outdoorsman who shared his passions generously with his family. They enjoyed flying, riding and keeping their home in the country. He was predeceased by his brother Art and his sister Marjory Hunt. Besides his wife and children, he leaves his sister, Dorothy Beaudoin of Ann Arbor, Michigan and his brother William, of Rangeley, Maine. He was grandfather to Mei and LiLi Kane.
