Michael J. Montos, 89, of Newington, husband of Helen Calos Montos, died Tuesday February 22, 2005 at New Britain General Hospital. Born in Chicopee Falls, MA, he lived in New Britain for 23 years, moving to Newington in 1966. A graduate of Chicopee High School, Class of 1933, Mike served with the U.S. Army in World War II, was a Bronze Star recipient and was part of the D-Day Invasion first wave in Normandy. He was a Department Manager in the Hardware Division of Stanley Works, where he worked for 39 years until his retirement in 1981. He was a member and former president of St. George Greek Orthodox Church, New Britain; and was also a member of the DAV; the American Legion; and the Golden Rascals at the church. He served as former president of the Chamberlain School PTA.

Besides his wife Helen, he leaves a son, Peter Montos and his wife Kathleen of Enfield; two daughters, Catherine Ruff and her husband Leonard of Windsor Locks, and Denise Montos of New Britain; two sisters, Christine Lawson of Chicopee Falls and Elizabeth LaBonte and her husband Al of Palmer, MA; seven grandchildren; two great grandchildren; several nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by his parents, James and Catherine Montos and a brother, Nick Montos.

Funeral services are Friday 9:15 AM at Carlson Funeral Home, 45 Franklin Square, New Britain and 10 AM at St. George Greek Orthodox Church. Burial with military honors will be in Fairview Cemetery. Calling hours are Thursday 5 to 8 PM at Carlson Funeral Home. A Trisagion Service will be conducted at 7 PM Thursday.
