



## Mildred "Millie" Mills

August 9, 1917 - January 11, 2006

Mildred Beach Mills, 88, of New Britain, died Wednesday January 11, 2006 at St. Francis Hospital in Hartford. She was the widow of Clifton Mills, who died in 1989. Born and raised in Terryville, she lived in New Britain most of her life. "Millie" was a nanny and children's nurse at several private homes and also was a nurses aide at several local convalescent homes. She was a former member of Emmanuel Baptist Church in Newington and the former Bethel Alliance Church in New Britain and attended the Providence Bible School. From "Millie's" love for people, she was constantly seeking new friends and "small world" stories.

Surviving are two sons, John Mills and his wife Patricia of Avon; and David Mills in Perris, California; two granddaughters, Kristen Mills of Columbus, Ohio and Pamela Mills of Simsbury. Besides her husband, she was predeceased by a brother, Karl Beach.
