Myles A. Buckley, 79, of Kensington, husband of Mary Guyer Buckley, passed away Friday January 4, 2008 at the Hospital of Central Connecticut in New Britain. Born in Springfield, MA, Myles has been a Kensington resident since 1966. He was employed at United Technologies in the Turbo, Power & Marine Division in Farmington for 40 years, until his retirement in 1988. He is a veteran of both World War II and the Korean Conflict serving in the US Navy. Myles is a member of St. Paul's Church in Kensington and the Berlin American Legion Post.

Besides his wife Mary, he is survived by 4 sons, Myles J. Buckley of Windsor; Jeffrey M. Buckley and his wife Jo Ellen of Roswell, GA; Mark A.
