Nancy A. Brown, 68, of the Amston section of Hebron, passed away Sunday (May 16, 2021) at Hartford Hospital. Born in New Britain, daughter of Stanton P. Brown Sr. and Dorothy (Northrop) Brown. Nancy was raised in East Berlin and is a graduate of Berlin High School Class of 1971. Nancy was a longtime Newington resident until moving to Amston in 2015.

She was previously employed at Morse School of Business in Hartford for 10 years where she proudly developed the school's stenography program becoming the only nationally accredited school in Connecticut. While at Morse, Nancy also traveled the country for stenography conferences where she lectured about her program. Nancy took a job with the State of CT Judicial Branch where she was the Supervisor of Transcript Services and then became Program Manager for Superior Court Operations retiring after 18 years of service in 2017.

Surviving are two sons, Todd Hungerford and his wife Michaela of Portland; and Seth Hungerford and his wife Shari of Olney, MD; a brother, Stanton P. "Chip" Brown, Jr of Storrs; a sister, Marcia Brown and her husband Brian King of Hull, MA; Nancy was a loving and proud grandmother to Olivia, twins Jackson and Gavin, Harrison, Ethan, and twins Aiden and Avery, as well as an eighth on his way this July. Nancy was predeceased by two sisters, Susan Brown and Holly Brown Hadfield and a niece, Amy Hadfield.

Nancy was lovingly known as “Grammy” to her seven grandchildren. Family was always the most important thing to her.
