Neil Batogowski, 58, of Berlin, beloved husband of Ruth Cornish Batogowski, passed away Saturday September 6, 2003. Born in New Britain, he was a lifelong resident of Kensington and Berlin. A graduate of Berlin High School, Class of 1962, he was a postal clerk at both Kensington and Berlin Post Offices for 37 years, retiring this past June 1st. A former member of the Connecticut National Guard, he was a member of St. Paul's Church, Kensington; the Polish Political Club of Kensington; and was a former member of Msgr. Greylish Council, Knights of Columbus.

Besides his wife Ruth, he leaves his mother, Justine Quarello Batogowski of Kensington; two sisters, Carol Brazoski of Berlin, and Gail Runnells and her husband Richard, also of Berlin; several nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by his father, Alphonse "Red" Batogowski.

Funeral services are Wednesday 9:15 AM at Carlson Funeral Home, 45 Franklin Square, New Britain followed by a Mass of Christian Burial 10 AM at St. Paul's Church, 485 Alling Street, Kensington.
