Norman K. Johnson, 81, of Kensington, has gone home to God Wednesday June 29, 2005. Born in New Britain, son of the late Carl E. and Edith Kallberg Johnson, whom he dearly loved, he was a graduate of Berlin High School, Class of 1941 and Upsala College in New Jersey in 1946. A bachelor, Norm was also predeceased by two sisters, Marjorie Johnson and Virginia Johnson. A Lieutenant with the Army Air Corp in World War II, he was a bombardier with the 8th Air Force. He was employed at Pratt & Whitney Aircraft in East Hartford for over 25 years until his retirement in 1979. Norm was an active member of First Lutheran Church in New Britain where he served as a member of the Church Council and Finance Committee; was a member of the church choir; and was a tour planner for the Midways group of the church. Norm owned property and was on the association board at Lake Hayward in Colchester. A Berlin Town Constable and Justice of the Peace, he was a member of the Berlin Republican Town Committee. Norm was an artist, gardener, lover of opera and “family gatherer” keeping the family in touch even with extended family in Sweden.

Surviving is a brother, Carl “Bud” Johnson of Florida; a sister, Phyllis Davidson of Newington; several nieces and nephews including Lori Hall of Lebanon; Deborah Coan of Newington; Carol McQueeney of New Castle, Indiana; Scott Johnson of Torrington; Dale Johnson of Bristol; Robin Davidson-Catalano of Acton, MA; Jill Davidson-Moffie of Beverly, MA; Kirsten

Abresch of Peachtree, GA; as well as numerous grandnieces and grandnephews.
