June 25, 1920 - October 4, 2002

Norman E. Lindroth, Sr., 82, of Newington, died Friday October 4th at New Britain General Hospital. A New Britain native and former resident, he lived in Newington since 1939. A WW II US Army veteran, he was a two time Purple Heart recipient. Norm worked as a correctional officer for the State of Connecticut in Somers for 23 years, retiring in 1980. He was a member of the Disabled American Veterans DAV and the 7th Division Infantry Association. He was a former member of Walnut Hill Lodge, AF&AM in New Britain. Surviving is his wife Dorothy Goodrich Lindroth; 3 sons, Norman Lindroth Jr. and his wife Karin of New Hartford; Robert Lindroth of Newington; and James Lindroth and his wife Elaine of Andover; a daughter, Jean Baggish and her husband Jerrold of Stafford Spring; a brother, John Lindroth of Dallas Texas; a sister, Betty Hill of Plainville; 5 grandchildren, Erik, Kevin, and Tamryn Lindroth; Debra Baggish; and Paula Bunce; a great grandson, Ryan Bunce; several nieces and nephews.
