



## Otto R. Dalke

February 9, 1915 - January 5, 2003

Otto R. Dalke, 87, of Malden Mass., formerly of Kensington, died Sunday January 5, 2003 in Wilmington, Mass. He was the widower of Dolores Rousseau Dalke who died in 1998. A New Britain native and former resident, he moved to Kensington in 1945 and lived in Massachusetts the past 2 years. A World War II US Army veteran, he served in Africa and Europe and was a Purple Heart recipient. Otto was store manager for Weiner Auto Parts in Bristol for 25 years, retiring in 1980. He was a charter member of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Kensington and the "Over the Hill Gang" at the church. He was also a member of the DAV Disabled American Veterans and the VFW Post in Berlin.

Surviving is his son Ronald Dalke of Malden, Mass; 2 grandsons, Douglas Dalke of Andover, Mass. and Matthew Dalke of Wilmington, Mass; 5 great grandchildren, Jacob, Samuel, Christopher, Casey, and Cory Dalke; several nieces and nephews.
