Paul J. Sabino, 82, of New Britain died unexpectedly Sunday April 16, 2006 at Shoreline Medical Center in Essex. He was the widower of Julia Langin Sabino who died in 2001. A native and lifelong New Britain resident, he owned Hardware City Welding and Pre-Engineered Steel Buildings, both of New Britain, until his retirement in 1992. Paul was a member of St. Ann's Church and the New Britain Elk's Lodge #957.
