Philip F. "Red" Karno, 90, of New Britain, husband of Mary Kondonellis Karno, passed away Sunday December 14, 2008 at Andrew House in New Britain. A native and life long New Britain resident, he was a World War II US Navy Veteran. In the 50's, he and his wife operated the Rialto Soda Shop on Broad Street and also worked at New Britain Machine Company for thirty years, retiring in 1980.

Besides his wife Mary, he leaves two sons, Philip G. Karno and his wife Betty of Omaha, Nebraska and Charles Karno and his wife Caroline of Plainville; two sisters, Barbara Karno and Agnes Salak, both of New Britain; five grandchildren, Philip Karno and his wife Stephanie of Richmond, Wisconsin; Paul Karno and Page Karno, both in Minneapolis, Minnesota; Katie Brennan Hinckly and her husband Tim of Ledyard; and Jillian Karno in Plainville; four great grandchildren, Breelyn and Benjamin Karno, Alexie Pryd and Kyle Hinckly; several nieces and nephews.
