Polly Welsh Chamberlain, 67, of Broad Brook, CT passed away on August 10, 2018 surrounded by family and friends after a courageous 11 year battle with Multiple Myeloma. Polly was born in Abington, PA and lived in New Hope, PA until moving to CT in 1956. She was the daughter of the late Valentine Burt Chamberlain III and Elizabeth Carter Chamberlain. Polly received her B.A. and M.S. degrees from Southern CT State University in New Haven. Polly worked in the field of Early Childhood Education as a Teacher, Director, Consultant and Licensing Specialist.

She enjoyed being with friends and family, being outdoors, taking walks, biking, and reading. She was a member of Mountain Laurel Ski Club. Polly had a special love of the French language, and she also enjoyed traveling, especially to Mexico where she and her amigo Ron went nine times.

Polly leaves behind a sister, Chris Chamberlain-Puffer and her husband John Puffer of Wilbraham, MA; two brothers: Valentine B. Chamberlain IV and his wife Patricia of Guilford, Michael P. Chamberlain and his wife Sharon of New Britain, CT and six nieces and nephews: Davis, Rick, Abby, Chase, Kate and Molly as well as 7 grand nieces and nephews: Ansen, Rowen, Eleanor, Carter, Annie, Weston and Hugo. 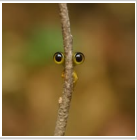
