Raymond Alexander Ruta, affectionately known as "Ray" and "Papa", of Kensington, passed away at the age of 90 on Wednesday (September 15, 2021) after a brief illness. He was the loving, devoted husband of Cynthia (Johnson) Ruta for the past 52 years. Born in New Britain, he graduated from New Britain High School with the Class of 1950 and regularly attended class reunions. Ray, the son of first generation Polish immigrants, graduated from the University of Connecticut in 1954, the first in his family to achieve a college degree. He was a proud veteran of the US Air Force and Reserve.

He has been a Kensington resident since 1971 where he and Cynthia proudly built the same home they lived at for nearly 50 years, raising their four children there. He was employed as a stock broker and financial adviser at Advest and several other investment firms for 46 years, retiring in 2003. Ray was a member of the St. Paul Church in Kensington; former Board Member of the New Britain YMCA & Salvation Army; was Past President of the New Britain Kiwanis Club; was a former member of the Berlin Board of Finance & Assessment; and a member of the Republican Town Committee.

An avid sports fan, Ray joyfully watched his alma mater women's basketball team win championship after championship, held season tickets for UCONN football games and enjoyed watching the Boston Red Sox. Ray devoured every notable financial newspaper and read the local newspapers cover to

cover every day. He loved animals, nature, and long walks, having many pets along the way while enjoying bird watching and amassing a large flower garden in his yard.

Most of all, he enjoyed spending time with his family, making countless trips with his wife to visit their children and grandchildren in Southern California, North Carolina, and Boston. His now adult children will fondly remember a devoted and fun Dad who actively participated in their childhood leaving them lifelong memories spoiling them with love, laughter and fun.

Besides his wife Cynthia, Ray leaves two sons, Donald Ruta of Plainville; and Robert "Bobby" Ruta and his wife Jennifer of Durham, NC; two daughters, Mary Fiske and her husband Craig of Laguna Niguel, CA; and Robin Rubin and her husband Jeffrey of Essex, MA; seven grandchildren, Craig Jr. (CJ), Simon Raymond, Kayleigh, Satchel, Jillian, Noah, and Dustin; and a great grandchild, Austin.
