May 5, 1925 - September 27, 2001

Robert C. Nygren, 76, of Ellwood Rd., Kensington, died Thursday Sept. 27, 2001 at New Britain General Hospital. Born in New Britain, he moved to Kensington in 1960. A graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1943, he took cadet training at North Carolina State University before entering the Army Air Corps, where he flew on more than 25 missions over Japan. He graduated from the University of Connecticut in 1950. He worked for the Retail Credit Co.; spent a number of years in auto retailing and at Investors Diversified Services; finishing his career with 17 years at Adkins Printing Co. Mr. Nygren was an usher and former church council member of First Lutheran Church and was a member of it's Midway Group. He was a member of the former Harmony Lodge AF&AM, now in Southington; Was on the Directors Staff of Sphinx Temple Shrine; and was a member of the Berlin VFW.
